Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed. We have made it through the six weeks of Lent in preparation for Resurrection Sunday and the season of Easter. We traveled with Peter's wandering heart through enthusiasm, doubt, fear, denial, and bewilderment. And maybe we experienced those same things on our Lenten journey. But we have arrived at the day that we've been all waiting for...the empty tomb. God's ultimate victory over death and our own sinfulness through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

If this were a movie, the credits would be about to roll. But this isn't a movie. This is real life. And the story isn't over yet. Of course, there's the fact that Easter is a season in our church calendar that lasts 50 days. Even then, the story isn't over. So, you may be asking yourself, "What comes next?"

I think we can take our cue from Mary and the disciples. It's our time to enter the story. Mary proclaimed on that first Easter morning, "I have seen the Lord." And she did not keep that news to herself. She told those who would listen.

She has encountered the risen Lord...the Lord of victory, the Lord of hope, the Lord of Life. That was good news then, and it still is. She didn't keep it to herself, and neither should we.

Jesus is lord, and as such has unimaginable power. And yet time and time again, he told the disciples to do things that he could have easily accomplished by saying the word. He could've commanded the fish to jump into the boat, but he told the disciples to cast out their nets. (See John 21) He could've restored the blind man's sight simply by declaring, "See!" But he covered his eyes in mud made with Jesus' spit and then told the man exactly where to go wash it off. (See John 9) Jesus uses partners in this work.

We step into this story now as a kingdom partner. It is now our turn to declare, "I have seen the Lord!" to a world that needs hope, signs of victory, and abundant life.

Because Easter isn't a day. It isn't a season. It is the way of Jesus Christ. As his disciples, we are Easter people who believe in the hope of resurrection, eternal life here on earth and the hereafter, and the kingdom of God. For we are people who have seen the Lord. Go and declare it.

Spring Is Here

Spring is in the air. After months of winter chill and ivy-cold mornings, nature is starting to thaw. Flowers are blooming, bees are buzzing, birds are singing, and warm winds are wafting. The sky is bluer, and the grass is greener. It's certainly easy to behold the beauty of God's creation when it erupts in color, birdsong, and new life in the spring. It's not only a delight for our senses but uplifting for our souls.

In fact, recent studies suggest that living close to nature or "greenspace" has significant and wideranging health benefits, such as lower rates of cardiovascular disease, type-2 diabetes, and stress.

Observe the beauty of the trees, which were made pleasing to the eye and good for food (Gen. 2:9).

Take time to smell the roses and be amazed by the myriads of flowers with different colors and scents. There are more than 400,000 different types of flowering plants. Jesus told us to consider the lilies of the field, that even Solomon in all his splendor was not dressed like one of them (Matt. 6:28-29).

No matter how hard humans try, we can't replicate the science of making a plant from seed and causing it to grow, with the resulting blossom of color, texture, scent, and symmetry, as well as nectar and pollen, food for the birds and bees.

Consider the blue sky. Peaceful, soft blue colors cause the body to produce calming chemicals. In fact, blue is the most calming color in the world. Strong blues stimulate clear thought, and softer blues calm the mind and aid concentration. If the sky was red we would all have higher blood pressure.

In Psalm 23 we read God makes us lie down in green pastures. Green is perhaps the most perfect contrast color. It reflects nature and vitality. According to scientists, there are at least a million hues of green that the human eye can perceive. (Being able to distinguish between them is another story).

As well as the physical beauty of God's creation, we also have the ability to appreciate the musical beauty. There are about 830 species of birds in Australia and almost 200 in New Zealand, including a variety of songbirds. Their songs are highly complex and can contain dozens of notes per second, and they never sing out of key!

So next time you find yourself outdoors, take time to enjoy the beauty of God's creation this Spring, and meditate on His wisdom and creativity. And why don't you plan some quiet time with God in His cathedral of creation.

From the Associate Pastor's Desk

Grace without truth is hypocrisy. Truth without grace is brutality.

One of my dearest friends and colleagues in ministry has often shared these words in conversations, preaching, and teaching contexts. And they always pack a holy punch for me. What is it that draws you to the gospel and the person of Jesus Christ? His grace? His truth? I don't believe it's supposed to be a bifurcated walk of faith where we arrogantly walk around as either/or people. We see both from Christ and we need both from Christ. Both grace and truth from His power to be able to live them out in a beautiful tension in our lives of faith, seeking to follow Jesus.

Many of us grew up in homes and/or churches where conflict was about the same as heresy - unacceptable! But as we know, where there are people, relationships, and community - there will be hard seasons, difficult conversations, and conflict. There will be the deep need for the truth of who Jesus is and who He calls us to be. That sort of honesty is hard and holy.

And we don't have much hope for ourselves or others without covering in grace the fullness of what it means to be honest with ourselves and others. The grace of Jesus saves us abundantly, richly, and wildly - to infinity and beyond. Before I get on my self-righteous high horse about how I'm better than someone else, I would do well to remember: *there but for the grace of God go I*.

As believers, are we called to honesty and accountability? Of course. Does what we say and how we say it - the intention of our hearts, the passive aggressiveness, the tone of our words - matter? Resoundingly, yes. People will know Christ in us by knowing us by our love for Him and our love for others. Especially those who are vulnerable and/ or hard to love. Repeating for myself here.

So as we celebrate the power of resurrection and new life in Christ, may we live it out in both grace and truth.


